- <u>CARE</u> (Citizens Assistance Registry for Emergencies): For elders or for people with certain disabilities. Key partners: the Vermont Enhanced 911 Board, Vermont Emergency Management, United Ways of Vermont, and Vermont 211. These agencies work together to provide a means for emergency responders to identify and aid CARE registrants in the event of a wide-scale emergency.

## Fire Safety:

- Check smoke alarms and replace batteries twice a year; we recommend doing this when you change your clocks for Daylight Savings
- If you have a wood stove or pellet stove have the chimney cleaned and checked once a year
- Don't use your oven to your heat your home
- Don't use propane heaters inside
- Practice what to do in case of a fire or other emergency, regularly, and involve the whole household.

#### **Power Outages and Winter Storms:**

- Report power outages to Green Mountain Power

- Be a good neighbor Check on elderly or special needs relatives, friends, and neighbors, to make sure they are keeping warm safely and have sufficient food and water.

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- Prepare for an outage: have a weeks' worth of food and water. Fill your bathtub with water so you may flush your toilet.
- Open cabinets and have water faucets drip when in an extended outage to prevent pipes bursting in extreme cold
- Ensure all heating outside vents are clear of snow or other obstructions to prevent Carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Have a well-stocked Winter Home Emergency Supply Kit that includes flashlights, portable radio, extra batteries, a first aid kit, bottled water and non-perishable food.
- Keep vehicle gas tanks above ½ way full if not full at all times though the winter. If you get stuck on the road you may need to idle for a long time to stay warm. Or, if there is a power outage, a resource to shelter in your vehicle.
- Have a well-stocked Winter Emergency Car Kit: Flashlight and extra batteries, Charged cell
  phone/automobile charger, Basic first-aid kit, Pocket knife, Blankets, Extra clothes (boots,
  mittens, socks), High-calorie, non-perishable foods, Windshield scraper & brush, Battery jumper
  cables, Road flares/reflectors, Brightly colored cloth to utilize as a flag and Road maps
